Become a high-voltage lineworker apprentice

A lineworker apprenticeship offers:

- \$40+/hour starting salary as an apprentice.
- Overtime pay.
- Work and train throughout the Pacific Northwest.
- 4-year training program.
- Comprehensive health care coverage (medical, dental, vision, life, etc.).
- Paid holidays, paid leave and sick leave.
- Agency matching retirement savings (Thrift Savings Plan).
- Career advancement with paid classroom time.

Lineworker apprentice job duties:

- Performing construction and maintenance work on wood poles and steel tower lines.
- Replacing or repairing damaged steel towers, wood poles, cross-arms and conductors.
- Maintaining rights-of-way.
- Repairing access roads and installing or repairing bridges, culverts, fences and gates.
- Setting up equipment and tools for line crews.
- Patrolling transmission lines and reporting on the condition of lines.
- Driving heavy equipment and supplies to job sites.
- Operating off-road equipment on the rights-of-way.
- Supporting line crew in general labor.
- Studying as assigned.
