## **ATCID Streamlining Phases**

#### 1. BPA is beginning to streamline its ATCID

a. This effort is being driven by BPA's goal to have a transparent Shortterm Available Transfer Capability (ST ATC) methodology, and by BPA's challenges with keeping the current ACTID updated as required by NERC ATC MOD-001, Requirement 3

#### 2. The ATCID streamlining effort consists of three phases:

- a. Phase I: Consolidate the separate sections on the 1:1 ATC and Flow-Based ATC Paths into one
- b. Phase II: Review the content within the document and eliminate any unnecessary information, with a focus on content that is remaining from BPA's use of MOD-030
- c. Phase III: Streamline/simplify the document overall, with a specific focus on the sections that detail BPA's firm and non-firm ATC calculations

### Overview of Phase I Changes

- 1. The 1:1 and Flow-Based ATC Path sections have been consolidated into a single section that describes how BPA calculates ST ATC for all its ATC Paths
- Duplicative language and sections covering WECC base cases and the calculation of interim Existing Transmission Commitments (ETC) have been consolidated
- 3. Definitions for ETC and ATC components have been conformed to the definitions in MOD-029-2a
- 4. Content has been relocated throughout the document as needed to provide for better flow and clarity
- 5. BPA did not delete any content within the current ATCID and instead focused on consolidating duplicated information
- 6. BPA's processes and methodology for calculating ST ATC have not changed

# **Review Changes in ATCID**

- 1. BPA will go through a draft ATCID Version 65 during this portion of the meeting
  - a. The draft ATCID Version 65 contains the changes resulting from the Phase I streamlining
- 2. We will be working from a clean version of the document today
  - a. Due to the extensive changes in the document, the red-lined version is hard to follow
  - b. Version 64 is available at the following link, and can be referenced as a comparison to the draft Version 65:
